



ANA'S JOURNEY

Ana's life began in the Hogar, alongside her sister Delia. Their mother, deemed too impoverished to care for them, had to have her daughters entrusted to the orphanage.

Years later. Ana's reunion with her mother was bittersweet. Tragically, her mother succumbed to vices—abandoning work, indulging in alcohol and drugs, and disappearing into the night. Delia, seeking a better life, left for the United States, leaving Ana behind.

At just 12 years old, Ana faced solitude. Her aunt stepped in, providing care until she, too, faced adversity—a lymph node cancer diagnosis that necessitated urgent treatment in Guatemala and a lengthy quarantine.

Alone once more AGC stepped in. Angel and his wife Mayra extended their hands and watched over Ana with her Aunt's approval,

offering solace and stability. Now, returned to her aunt's care, Ana attends school, her spirit resilient despite the hardships.

Angel once noticed Jimme walking around in torn shoes, prompting us to step in and ensure he received new ones. This act of care reflects the heart of our mission.

Jimme's personal story is even more compelling. His mother tragically lost her life in a bus accident on a foggy day. Left with the responsibility of raising Jimme and his three siblings, their father struggled. Balancing farm work and parenting proved too demanding, leading him to make a difficult decision: he entrusted their care to the orphanage. His dad was a strong Christian and instilled faith in Jimme, emphasizing that God was in control and His will was unfolding. He maintained a steadfast presence in Jimme's life and visited with every opportunity

For the first few years, he did not like being there. It was very difficult to see God's purpose in his life. Eventually, he began to adapt and learn a lot. He learned how to weld and care for animals and a lot about construction from Angel. Everything he learned in the Hogar permitted him to grow and develop the tools he's using now in life and architecture.

"For the longest time, I thought that God didn't have a purpose in my life because I wasn't being raised by my mom and dad but I realize now that God used all of those moments to prepare me for exactly
